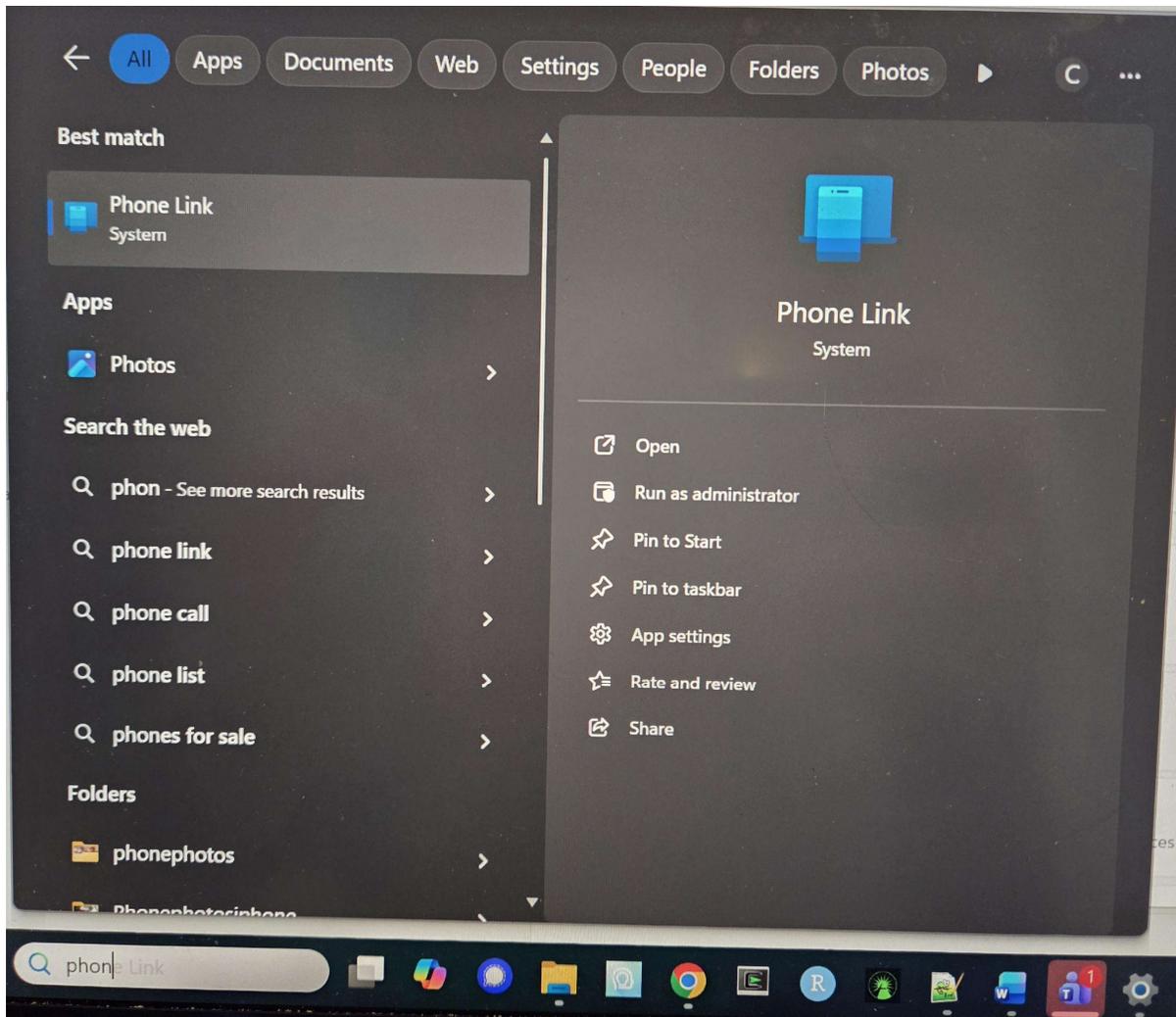

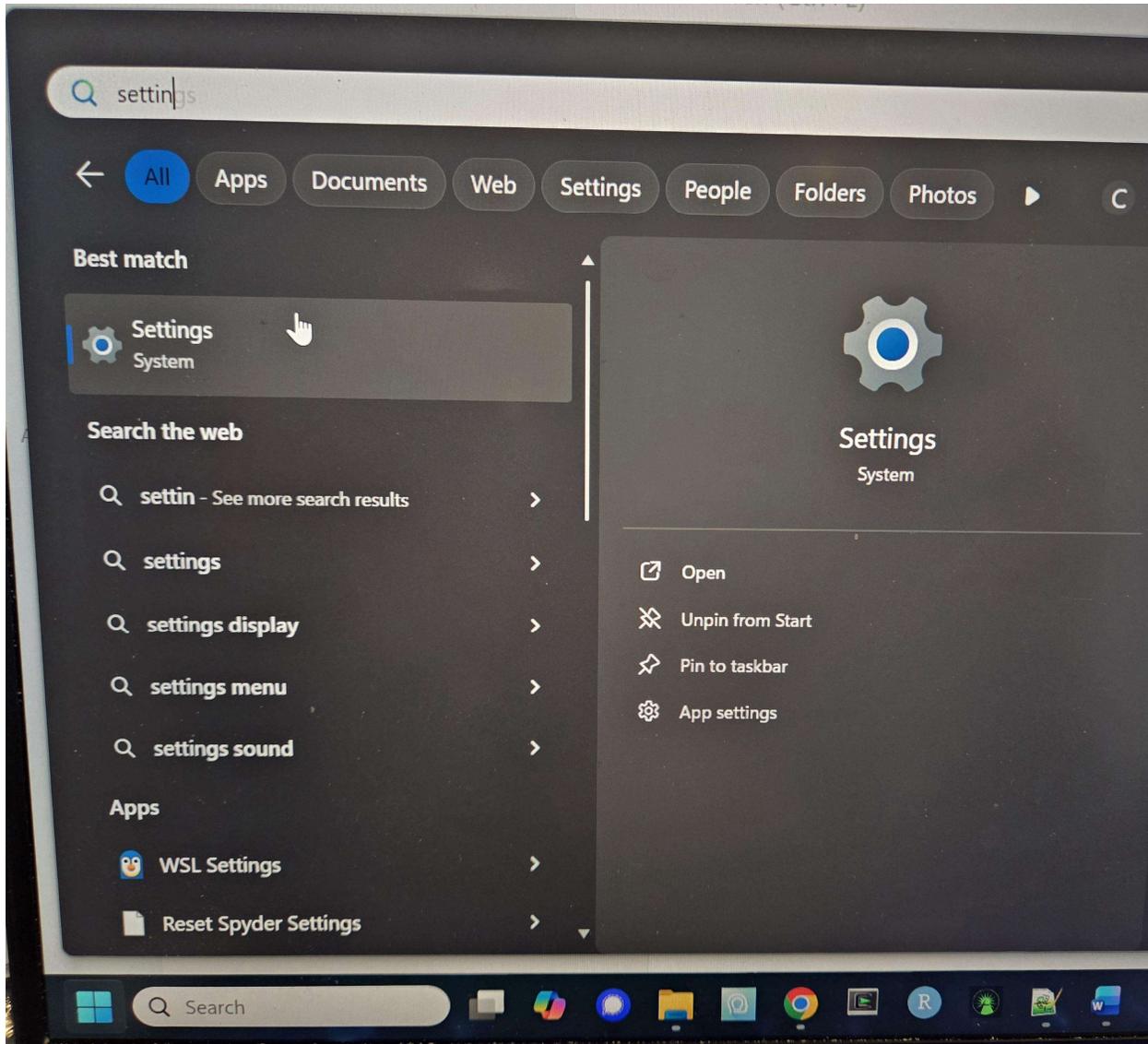

### **Procedure:**

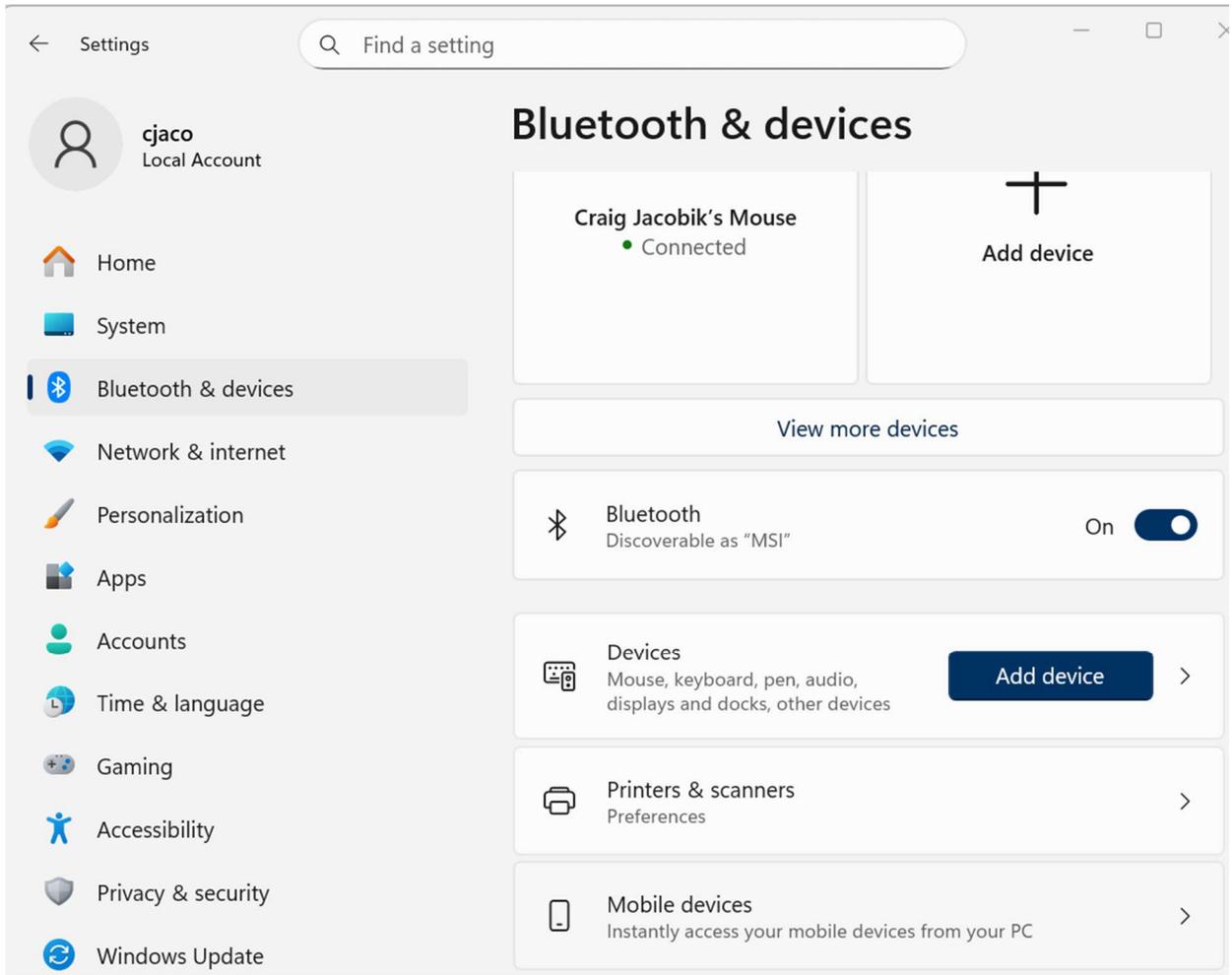
1. On a phone, open “Link to Windows” app on Android. Log into your Microsoft account (needs to be a personal one and not a student/work one)
2. On a computer, open “Phone Link” app in Windows. Log into the same Microsoft account



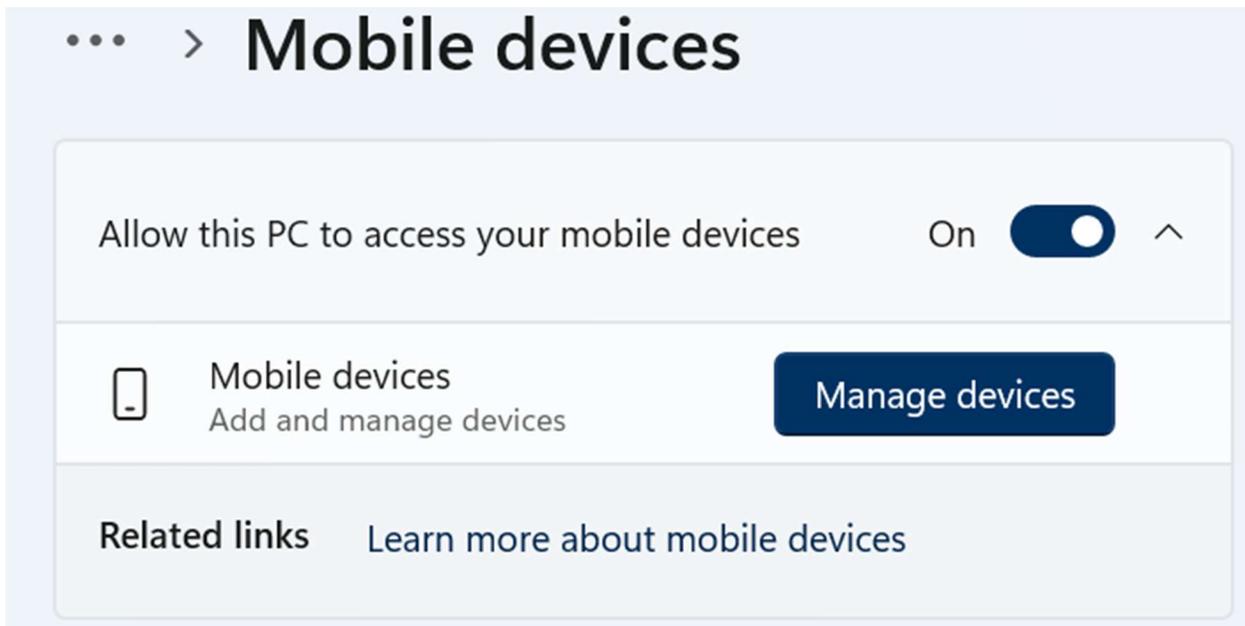
3. Open Windows search bar and find system "Settings"



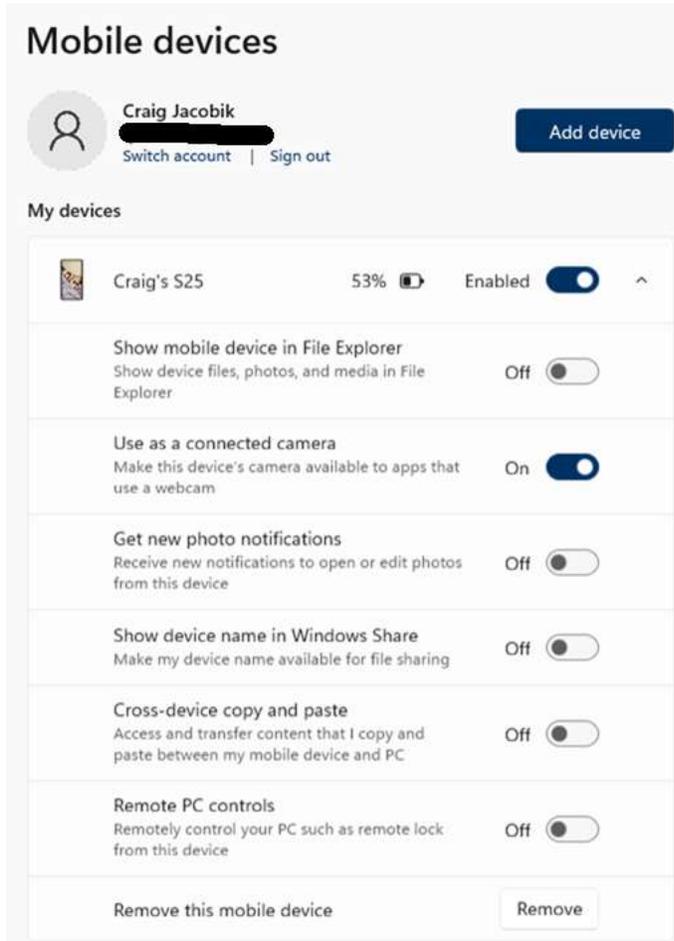
4. On the left side, select “Bluetooth & devices”. Then, on the resulting window on the right side, select “Mobile devices”, specifically the “>”.



5. Click Manage Devices



6. Make sure that the device is enabled. Disable all of the options except make sure that “Use as a connected camera” is enabled.



7. Start Honorlock as you normally would. When you get to the camera/”Face Detection” screen, you need to change your camera from your integrated laptop camera to your phone’s camera.
  - a. Your phone camera must be unlocked for the duration of the exam
  - b. We recommend plugging it in to ensure sufficient battery life.
